Life After Polio

A local resident, whose great grandfather moved to this area many years ago, and helped with its growth, gave us a wonderful talk on his youth, and suffering from polio just before starting to school. Jack Emmott III told how he would be placed up on the stand above the baseball fields #3, 4 and 5, and would give a running commentary of the game his cousins and friends were playing but he could not. He told of living near 45 cousins and 15 aunts and

uncles in what was called Emmottsville, and of the many dairy farms in the area. Houston Cy-Fair Lions Club sponsored him to Texas Lions Camp in 1960, when he was 12 years old. He said he didn't want to go, but that his parents thought the two weeks at Camp with other kids with polio would be good for him. He was miserable and terribly homesick at first, but eventually loved his time at Texas Lions Camp. He told how he used an iron lung at night during his 30's to allow his breathing muscles to rest and heal. Although confined to a wheelchair, he leads an active life, is a divorce lawyer, saying his role is to be a peacemaker between the two parties.
